God has blessed us beyond measure and though the future may seem unclear, let's face it together with faith and hope. God has a plan for each of us, and He will see us through.


Sunday School Update & Thank Yous

Soon we will be enjoying colorful flowers as our temperatures warm up. Eunice MacDonald and her garden helpers will be back working in our Memorial Garden and other flowerbeds here at Redeemer. How did Eunice learn her garden talent? She says as her grandma aged and could not bend to care for her garden, Eunice went to live with her for a couple years and it was there that she learned about gardening.

Eunice (Troullier) comes from a large close-knit family, many you may have met here at Redeemer. When her parents, Elmer and Anna, first married, they lived with Anna's parents in rural Kossuth, in Kellnersville area and four children were born while there. In the mid 1930's, the family built a house on N. 17th Street across the street from what was the first Redeemer church. Redeemer's pastors, including Huber, Mack, Barg and Gumz, often visited with Elmer in his garage where he used his mechanically inclined talents while he was also a Manitowoc County foreman. Anna and children all joined Redeemer and old-timers remember how Anna was an outstanding baker and cook at church as well as at home. Sounds like most of the family took advantage of her results rather than continuing her talents.


Over the years, the family grew to 12 children: (D-deceased). Norman-D, Kenny-D, Cliff (Elaine), Eunice MacDonald, Josie (Bob-D) Novak, Vern (LaVonne-D), Milt-D (Janice), Dorothy (Tom) Klein, LaVerne (Ron-D) Schmidt, Allan (Linda), Bonnie (Steve) Wagner, Tommy-D. When Redeemer built the present church all members walked and carried belongings from the old chapel as they closed the doors and arrived at 1712 Menasha Ave. on Oct. 23, 1960. (You can read history in the Anniversary Directory.)

Eunice's school years were in Manitowoc, after which she took a bookkeepers job at a drug store in Milwaukee where she met her husband. Other bookkeeping jobs followed with David Douglas, Northwestern Mutual, A & P Milk Company until they moved and then she worked at Manitowoc Company until she retired. Eunice was blessed with three children: Mike-D, Michele (Einai) Hanson, Hudson, WI, and Mark (Parvene), Wheeton, IL along with eight grandchildren.

Many of the Troullier siblings lived elsewhere over the years but have all now returned to Manitowoc. Oh, the good times and memories they share and treasure. They never had to worry about a friend as they had each other. There are about 90 at their Christmas get-togethers. Several gather at Wagon Wheel or elsewhere on Thursdays and admit it gets noisy.

Eunice has been volunteering her garden skills ever since this church was built but shrubbery and flowerbeds have changed locations. In the fall of 2000, Rev. Miller presented the idea of a Memorial Garden. Landscaping began in the area north of the fellowship hall and developed into the beautiful garden, which we now enjoy. Eunice has had several excellent hard-working helpers and at present are Doris Griepentrog. Shirley Bowe and Ramona Kowitz. She could use more volunteers.

Over the years, Eunice has also been involved in Ladies Aid activities, Women's Missionary and choir while she tends to her beautiful yard and home with special treasures.
