

All things are possible for one who believes." ²⁴Immediately the father of the child cried out and said, "I believe; help my unbelief!" ²⁵And when Jesus saw that a crowd came running together, he rebuked the unclean spirit, saying to it, "You mute and deaf spirit, I command you, come out of him and never enter him again." ²⁶And after crying out and convulsing him terribly, it came out, and the boy was like a corpse, so that most of them said, "He is dead." ²⁷But Jesus took him by the hand and lifted him up, and he arose. ²⁸And when he had entered the house, his disciples asked him privately, "Why could we not cast it out?" ²⁹And he said to them, "This kind cannot be driven out by anything but prayer."



Statement on Holy Communion

The Lord's Supper is joyfully received here every weekend and on other holy days. At the altar, our Lord Jesus Christ delivers His true body and blood into our mouths. His gift of body and blood, given in, with, and under the bread and wine, bestows tremendous benefits. His body and blood forgives our sins, strengthens our faith, binds us to the Lord, and unites us with each other. In this is life and salvation.

All members of the Lutheran Church–Missouri Synod have publicly confessed this sacred gift and its blessings, and so are encouraged to commune. Other guests wishing to join our confession and receive this Holy Sacrament are asked to meet with a pastor before communing for the first time. When you have examined yourself according to Christ's bidding (1 Corinthians 11:17-34), come to His Supper rejoicing, just as Jesus asks, knowing that our Lord meets you at His altar with joy. Those coming to the altar for a blessing rather than the Holy Supper are asked to cross their arms over their chest.

Pastor Huehn's Installation

We are very excited to announce that Pastor Huehn will be installed at Redeemer on October 27th at 4:00pm. District President Rev. Eric Skovgaard will be preaching and a reception will follow the service. We would love to see as many congregation members as possible to help us celebrate this joyous occasion.

An Update on our Pipe Organ

We have been in touch with Peters, Weiland and Company (Organbuilders out of Milwaukee) to do some repairs to our organ, as well as to install a system called 'Substitute Organ Service' (or SOS). This program allows us to choose our hymns, liturgy, and service music off their site, and then they prepare and produce the order of service which is played back on our own organ. While our preference will always be for an organist to play for us during our services, this is an outstanding alternative that will certainly come in handy in the future. We are still several weeks out from this being installed, but watch the bulletin for updates.
