




Distribution of the Sacrament

Statement on Holy Communion

The Lord's Supper is joyfully received here every weekend and on other holy days. At the altar, our Lord Jesus Christ delivers His true body and blood into our mouths. His gift of body and blood, given in, with, and under the bread and wine, bestows tremendous benefits. His body and blood forgives our sins, strengthens our faith, binds us to the Lord, and unites us with each other. In this is life and salvation.

All members of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod have publicly confessed this sacred gift and its blessings, and so are encouraged to commune. Other guests wishing to join our confession and receive this Holy Sacrament are asked to meet with a pastor before communing for the first time. When you have examined yourself according to Christ's bidding (1 Corinthians 11:17-34), come to His Supper rejoicing, just as Jesus asks, knowing that our Lord meets you at His altar with joy. Those coming to the altar for a blessing rather than the Holy Supper are asked to cross their arms over their chest.

Call update

As we noted before Sunday service last week, after prayerful consideration, Pastor Holden declined our call. Pastor Holden had nothing but positive comments for our church, the people he met, our preschool, and the call. Pastor Holden believes his prayers led him to understand God's place at this point in time is for him to remain in his current ministry, and especially in his college ministry. This is unfortunate, as having spent the better part of two days with the man, I believe he would have been a great Senior Pastor for all of our members and our Congregation. We sincerely wish him God's blessings on his future. I want to also take a moment to reiterate my 'thank you' to everyone on the Call committee, the Board, Johanna Harris, Aaron Utecht, and all involved in the call and Pastor Holden's visit, for sharing their time and commitment to our church. Preparing a Call, from the vetting of candidates, to the mailing of the Call Packet, is a difficult, deep, prayerful, thought provoking, gut wrenching, incredibly time consuming process done in consideration of all of Redeemer's needs by a group of volunteers serving our Congregation, proceeding from a prayerful and faithful position to consider all of our needs for our next senior pastor. Please thank these people directly for their service to us in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Relative to the call, we are starting over. The call committee will be meeting soon to discuss the path forward. As far as candidates, we have the option to revisit the original list sent to us by the district, take new solicitations from members, and/or request a new list from the district. We will keep everyone updated as things move forward.

To completely clarify what we were allowed to share last week, Good Shepherd in TR is preparing to interview Pastor Brassfield for a possible opportunity, "to serve them in a bivocational, part-time position in which he could keep his

contracting business as well as serve the congregation. The church, the pastor, the Visitor, and even the District President are excited and optimistic about the arrangement". Apparently we were not clear when we announced this last week, as word came back that Redeemer announced Pastor Brassfield accepted a call at Good Shephard. I will personally apologize for any confusion created, because that was clearly not the intended message. As of the bulletin deadline, this is the latest info we have.

We are in the midst of a difficult process for our Congregation made more difficult by the fact we have not been in this situation – calling a senior pastor – I believe, since 1984. In many ways, this is new territory and we are all human and not perfect. As I'm sure we all are, I will continue to pray for the Call Committee, all members of our Congregation, and the Executive Board, Pastor Brassfield, and that God will deliver us our Senior Pastor as is his will, per his plan.
